On the occasion of the 15th Edition of the Reate Festival, The Flavio Vespasiano Foundation is organizing a Singing Masterclass on September 25th, 26th, 27th and 28th, with a final concert on September 28th, 2023. This Masterclass will focus on Italian bel canto and will take place in Rome at the Sala Casella of the Accademia Filarmonica Romana. The teachers of the Masterclass are soprano ROSA FEOLA, baritone SERGIO VITALE and pianist FABIO CENTANNI.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

ADMISSIONS

All opera singers aged 32 or under can participate in the Masterclass as active students; there is no age limit for those who want to attend as auditors.

HOW TO PARTICIPATE

To participate in the selection for admission to the Masterclass, the following documentation must be sent to the email address concorso@reatefestival.it by the deadline of September 10th, 2023.

- Application for admission (Annex A), filled in and attached to the following Competition announcement;
- Curriculum Vitae:
- A copy of a valid identity card or passport document;
- Music programme with names of composers, titles of the pieces with the relevant durations;
- Link to a video uploaded on YouTube or similar platforms with a live performance, without cutting or editing within the single pieces, of the program chosen for participation in the masterclass. The program may consist of one or more pieces, with a total duration of between five and fifteen minutes.



According to the videos sent, the teachers will select a maximum of twelve active students who will be admitted to participate.

REGISTRATION OF ACTIVE STUDENTS

On the Reate Festival official website, by 20 September 2023, will be published the list of the twelve admitted active students; the Fondazione Flavio Vespasiano will send an e-mail to the students admitted to the Competition.

The active students admitted to participating must send to the following e-mail address concorso@reatefestival.it by the deadline of 22 September 2023 the Registration Form (Annex B) and the Participation Form (Annex C), together with a copy of the payment of the attendance fee.

At the end of the Masterclass, a public concert will take place in which the active students, on the teacher's instructions, are expected to participate.

The best student of the Masterclass, at the unquestionable judgement of the teacher, may be included in the Reate Festival programme. For this performance, the chosen student will be reimbursed for the expenses.

AUDITOR STUDENTS

Candidates interested in attending as auditors - and those excluded from the admission list as active participants but who have indicated this in their application form (having ticked both boxes in Annex A) - must send the Registration Form (Annex B) and the Participation Form (Annex C) to the email address concorso@reatefestival.it by the deadline of September 22nd, 2023, along with a copy of the receipt of payment of the envisaged attendance fee.

The course will be activated with a minimum of eight active participants. The registration fees paid will be refunded in full in the event of cancellation due to cases of force majeure.

On the first day, Monday, 25 September 2023, the meetings will start at 15:00.

The final concert will be held on Thursday, 28 September 2023, at 20:00 at the Sala Casella of the Accademia Filarmonica Romana Via Flaminia 116 - 00196 Roma.

Rosa Feola



came to international attention after winning multiple awards including Second Prize, The Audience Prize and the Zarzuela Prize at the Plácido Domingo World Opera Competition (2010). This year Rosa was awarded the Premio Speciale of the Spoleto Festival dei Due Mondi. Operatic roles include Corinna Il viaggio a Reims, Adina L'elisir d'amore, Gilda Rigoletto, Norina Don Pasquale, Susanna Le nozze di Figaro, Amina La sonnambula to name just a few, performing at houses including Teatro alla Scala, Metropolitan Opera New York, Teatro dell'Opera in Rome, Opernhaus Zurich, Bayerische

Staatsoper,Ravenna Festival, Lyric Opera Chicago, Teatro Regio Torino, Salzburg Festival and the Deutsche Oper Berlin. She released her debut solo CD in 2015 titled Musica e Poesia, accompanied by Iain Burnside.Recent highlights include Adina L'elisir d'amore at Teatro alla Scala, Donna Fiorilla Il turco in Italia at Opernhaus Zurich and Ilia Idomeneo at the Opera di Roma.Last season, Rosa returned to the role of Adina L'elisir d'amore at the Wiener Staatsoper and for her debut at Hamburg Staatsoper, as well as to La Scala for Il turco in Italia. In the 21/22 season, Rosa made her much anticipated debut at the Royal Opera House as Gilda in Rigoletto, a role she sings to acclaim across Europe and the USA. An exciting 2022-23 season has already seen Rosa return to the Metropolitan Opera, featuring as Olga in their production of Fedora as well as reprising the role of Gilda in Rigoletto. Later in the season, Rosa will return to Opernhaus Zurich to sing Liù in their performance of Turandot.

Sergio Vitale



The young baritone Sergio Vitale studied at the Accademia Nazionale di Santa Cecilia Opera Studio in Rome under the guidance of Renata Scotto and at the Accademia Chigiana in Siena with Renato Bruson. He made his debut as Giorgio Germont in *La traviata* and Schaunard in *La Bohème* at the Deutsche Oper Berlin, where he sung as soloist for the 2010/2011 season. He went on to sing as *Don Giovanni* (title role),

Daniel Oren conducting, at the Teatro Verdi in Salerno, Gianni Schicchi (title role) at the Auditorium Parco della Musica in Rome, Malatesta in Don Pasquale in Savona. He then performed in Falstaff (title role) at the Teatro della Fortuna in Fano; Il viaggio a Reims (Don Profondo) at the Rossini Opera Festival; Rigoletto (Marullo) on tour in Japan with the Teatro alla Scala; Il Barbiere di Siviglia (Figaro) at the Teatro San Carlo in Naples under the baton of Bruno Campanella; Madama Butterfly (Sharpless) at the Teatro Belli in Spoleto and in Il turco in Italia (Don Geronio) at the Teatro Vincenzo Bellini in Catania. Concert performances include Carmina Burana with the Orchestra Giovanile italiana in Milan; Faurè's Requiem at the Teatro Lirico in Cagliari and at the Teatro Petruzzelli in Bari; a concert at the Opèra de Nice; a concert of Rigoletto (Marullo) at the Concertgebouw in Amsterdam. Past engagements include Falstaff (concert version) with the first Italian Opera Accademy of Riccardo Muti at the Teatro delle Muse in Ancona with Cristina Mazzavillani Muti staging and at the Teatro San Carlo in Naples. He then appeared as Figaro (Il barbiere di Siviglia) at the Tiroler Festspiele in Erl under Gustav Kuhn and as Marcello (La Bohème) for the As.Li.Co Circuit in Italy. Sergio starred as Haly (L'italiana in Algeri) at the Teatro del Maggio Fiorentino under the baton of Bruno Campanella; De Siriex (Fedora) at the Teatro al San Carlo in Napoli; La traviata, Falstaff and La fanciulla del West at the Teatro Lirico in Cagliari; Battistelli's Il medico dei pazzi in Venice; L'italiana in Algeri at the Royal Opera House Muscat; La Bohème (Marcello) at Teatro Regio in Parma and in Bologna (a new production: Graham Vick directing and Michele Mariotti conducting); Giordano's Giove a Pompei in Foggia and Chieti; Malatesta in Don Pasquale in Salerno; Conte Gil in Il segreto di Susanna at the Reggia in Caserta (with the Teatro San Carlo); La traviata in Florence, Trapani and Porto (on tour with the Teatro Nacional de São Carlos); Falstaff at the Deutsche Oper am Rhein in Dusseldorf; Un ballo in maschera in Darmstadt; Roberto Devereux at the Teatro Regio in Parma and a new production of *Turandot* (Ping) at the Teatro Comunale in Bologna. Most recently he sang in La traviata in Trapani, Savona, Rieti, Macerata and Limoges; Gianni Schicchi in Brescia, Como, Pavia, Cremona and Ancona; L'elisir d'amore (Belcore) in Toulouse; Tosca and Le tre regine by Donizetti in Naples; Il maestro di cappella and Il segreto di Susanna in Genoa (where he also directed); La gorza del destino in Toulouse; Adriana Lecouvreur at the Teatro Comunale in Bologna; La fanciulla del West for Opera Lombardia; Simon Boccanegra in Parma; Rigoletto (title role) in Rouen and Madama Butterfly in Modena. Sergio Vitale made his debut at the Metropolitan Opera in New York in the production of Fedora (De Siriex) under the baton of Marco Armiliato.



Fabio Centanni

Fabio Centanni is one of the most sought-after collaborative pianists internationally, for both Italian Opera and Instrumental music. Born in Rome, he graduated from the Conservatory of Santa Cecilia in 1992 with full marks and honors. Numerous teachers have contributed to his training, including Sergio Perticaroli, Pavel Gililov, Michele Campanella, Franco Scala, Piernarciso Masi, Felix Ayo, Germaine Mounier, teachers with

whom he studied at the Accademia Chigiana of Siena, the "Mozarteum" Sommerakademie in Salzburg, the Accademia Nazionale di Santa Cecilia in Rome, the Incontri col Maestro Academy of Imola, and the Accademia Musicale in Pescara. Fabio has won numerous national and international competitions, including First Prize at the Competition of Terzo d'Acqui (Alessandria) in 1990, as well as First Prize at the National Piano Competition "City of Velletri", Third prize at the "Città di Sulmona" international competition in 1999, and the Critics Award at the 38th National Piano Competition "A. Speranza" of Taranto in 2000. From 2001 to 2015 he worked as a piano accompanist at the Accademia Nazionale di Santa Cecilia. He collaborated with Claudio Desderi (voice), Jacques Mauger (trombone), Guido Corti (horn), Carlo Tamponi and Andrea Oliva (flute), Gabriele Cassone and Andrea Lucchi (trumpet), Francesco Bossone (bassoon), and Domenico Nordio (violin.) In 2011, 2012, and 2017 he was also the piano accompanist of the violin course held by Prof. Sonig Tchakerian. Since 2006, Fabio has worked alongside Italian soprano Renata Scotto, with whom he has worked both as pianist and teaching assistant (Operastudio Academy of S. Cecilia, Renata Scotto Opera Program Naples-Florida, Masterclass Ópera de La Coruña). Between April 2006 and April 2008 he worked as Solo Repetiteur at the Deutsche Oper am Rhein in Düsseldorf-Duisburg, preparing numerous productions (L'elisir d'amore, Der fliegende Hollaender, L'amour des trois oranges, Falstaff, Otello, Tosca, Giulio Cesare, Carmina Burana, Lucia di Lammermoor, Faust, Un ballo in maschera, La Bohème) and performing in various concerts. In December 2012 he worked at the Grand Théâtre de Genève, accompanying the production of Richard III by Giorgio Battistelli. He was a guest of the Verbier International Festival from 2009 to 2012 as accompanist of Masterclasses of Maestro Claudio Desderi on Mozart's Don Giovanni (2009), of Maestra Nelly Miricioiu on Puccini's La Bohème (2010), as performer in the performance of Così fan tutte by Mozart in version for piano and string quartet (2011) and finally as coordinator of piano masterclasses (2012). Fabio is very active as both a Vocal Coach and a Lecturer at Universities and important International Institutions, including "Estúdio Voce" di Rio de Janeiro (2011-2016), Universidade Federal do Belo Horizonte (2016), Universidade Federal do Estado do Rio de Janeiro (2015), Casa da Cultura di Brasília (2015), Conservatoire National Supérieur de Musique di Beyrouth-Libano (2013), Université Antonine di Beyrouth-Libano, Conservatorio di Sydney (2014). In October 2010 he was the official pianist of the "Città di Brescia" International Violin Competition and since 2012 he has been the official pianist of the "A. Postacchini" International Violin Competition of Fermo. He currently teaches the Chamber Music course at the "G. Pierluigi da Palestrina" Conservatory of Cagliari.
